Community Safety update

The Council's Enforcement team were out with colleagues from Staffordshire Police on Thursday 5 December 2019 to conduct a joint operation. Alongside the standard police checks, our officers were checking that anybody transporting waste had a valid waste carrier licence and/or scrap metal licence. A total of nine vehicles were stopped and checked. Of the ones that were carrying waste, one had no waste carrier licence and was issued with a fixed penalty for £300, three had a waste carrier license and were able to produce them, and one had a waste carrier license but could not provide documents at the time. Policing issues encountered included speeding, potential drug driving and vehicles in a poor state of repair.

Safety warning over smoke alarm 'failure' rate

LGA analysis of official figures shows that almost 40% of battery-powered smoke alarms failed to activate in house fires in England in the last year - a figure that has remained virtually unchanged in nearly a decade. The LGA is urging householders to test their smoke alarms regularly, but especially during the run-up to Christmas when festive decorations, candles and lighting pose a potentially greater fire risk, and to fit more than one smoke detector in their homes, with at least one fitted on the ceiling of every floor.
